Dutch Hollow Lake Property Owner's Association Treasurer's Report January 2023

Revenue

- Revenues are \$16,211 over budget year to date.
- A total of 853 of the 2023 assessments were paid to date or 80% of the 1,163 lots. We budgeted for a total of 1,060 lots paying in 2023. Last year 818 lots paid at this time. This is 35 more lots paying in 2023 compared to 2022 (for reference in 2021 a total 828 assessments were paid at this time).

Some items to watch that are under budget:

• Seasonal camping fees are \$1,730 under budget – just a timing issue.

Expenses

• Overall, expenses year to date are over budget by \$11,190.

The main line item over <u>budget</u> include:

• Transfer to FDH \$13,000 for weed control - just a timing issue. Will end the year on budget.

Some items to watch that are <u>under budget</u>:

• Nothing at this time.

Fund Balances

- Small Project & Repair Fund No expenditures were made in January from the small projects and repairs line item in January. This leaves \$25,000 to spend in 2023 from the fund.
- Capital Project Fund We currently have \$78,234 left in the fund after accounting for all the 2023 approved projects. This includes the \$30,000 transfer from the Operating Fund from 2022 earnings that was approved in February. The Board has several projects to consider proposed for the Capital Fund in 2023.
- Major Capital Project Fund –We have a balance available for projects of \$89,290 in the major capital fund after accounting for 2023 Board approved projects, including a placeholder for potential fencing. The Board approved beach house deck project was moved to the Major Capital Fund due to its

- size. The Board has several proposed projects to consider from the Major Capital Fund in 2023. Past due assessments of \$2,010 were collected in January, which increased the balance available in the major capital fund.
- Timber Fund In January, there was a payment to Driftless Area of \$840 from the timber fund. The current balance in the timber fund is \$20,647.
